Initiated in 1978, in response to the 1970s fiscal crisis, GreenThumb assists community residents to transform once derelict vacant lots into community gardens.

Today, we educate and support community gardens and urban farming throughout NYC, while preserving open space.

Urban Agriculture / Market Gardens

"The life expectancy in New York City is higher than in the rest of the country....Yet there are too many New Yorkers without the ability to select healthy foods, because those foods are not on their store shelves."

Mayor De Blasio announced OneNYC to support community gardens and urban farms in low income neighborhoods to increase access to healthy foods



- Opportunities for residents to engage in growing local produce
- Educates youth about nutrition and offers training in food preparation, gardening and retailing skills
- GreenThumb expands model to service market gardens
- Public-private collaboration to max NYC urban agriculture potential



Urban Agriculture in GreenThumb Gardens

- Over 50% of Greenthumb gardens are food producing
- At least 200,000 pounds of edibles are grown each year
- Up to 35 operational Farmer's Markets and garden stands
- More than 2,000 fruit trees planted
- 40 community gardens with over 100 beehives
